



Elements of Prayer By Kim Miller

The Bible commands us to “*Pray without ceasing*” (1 Thessalonians 5:17). It is through prayer that we communicate with God. We speak to Him, “*Call unto me*” and He speaks to us, “*I will answer thee*” (Jeremiah 33:3). There isn’t a right way and a wrong way to pray. We are just to pray. However, the Bible shows us many examples of prayer and from them we can learn effective ways to pray. One such example of prayer is the Model prayer found in Matthew 6:9-13. In fact, Jesus begins His prayer with, “*After this manner therefore pray ye.*” It is for this reason I have chosen to look closely at this passage of scripture identifying what I believe are the five key elements of prayer as highlighted in this passage. Let us begin with the passage and follow with each of the five elements demonstrated.

After this manner therefore pray ye: Our Father which art in heaven, Hallowed be Thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil: For Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever. Amen. (Matthew 6:9-13 KJV)

Worship

The first element of prayer we see is worship. Jesus acknowledges who God is by calling Him Father and reverencing His Name. Revelation 4:11 further demonstrates our need to worship Him as it tells us He is worthy. “*Thou art worthy, O Lord, to receive glory and honour and power: for thou hast created all things, and for thy pleasure they are and were created.*”

Surrender

The second element of prayer we see is surrender. Jesus sacrifices His wishes and desires, wanting only the will of the Father. In I Peter 5:6 this concept of sacrificing our own will for that of the Father’s, that we might receive all God has for us is further emphasized. “*Humble yourselves therefore under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you in due time* (I Peter 5:6).

Petition

The third element of prayer we see is petition. Jesus doesn’t ask for anything for Himself until He has already praised God for who He is and acknowledged that God was in control. It is then and only then that Jesus comes to God asking for something. Too often our prayers look like a “gift list” we are demanding He fulfill. Instead of going to God in prayer we just spend a few minutes telling Him what we want and quickly leave our prayer never giving Him any opportunity to speak to us, never loving Him or praising Him, simply demanding of Him.

“*Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need*” (Hebrews 4:16). However, our petitions to God should not be the focus of our prayer. “*By Him therefore let us offer the sacrifice of praise to God continually, that is, the fruit of our lips giving thanks to His name*” (Hebrews 13:15).

Confession

The fourth element of prayer we see is confession. It is important that we keep our hearts and minds pure in Christ Jesus. We want our prayer life to be effective and *"If I regard iniquity in my heart, the Lord will not hear me"* (Psalm 66:18). But thanks be to God, *"If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness"* (I John 1:9).

Thanksgiving

The fifth and final element of prayer we see demonstrated in this passage of scripture is thanksgiving. It seems so odd to me that one would even have to mention thanksgiving but I know in my own life that thanksgiving is sometimes overlooked. God is so good to us, so gracious to us, so loving to us and so wonderful. How could we not be thankful for Him?

"Make a joyful noise unto the LORD, all ye lands. Serve the LORD with gladness: come before His presence with singing. Know ye that the LORD He is God: it is He that hath made us, and not we ourselves; we are His people, and the sheep of His pasture. Enter into His gates with thanksgiving, and into His courts with praise: be thankful unto Him, and bless His name. For the LORD is good; His mercy is everlasting; and His truth endureth to all generations" (Psalm 100).

Thoughts on Prayer By Bethany S. Ross

Prayer - what a topic! Any of us who have seen prayer in action could easily come up with a list seven miles long about how powerful, essential and wonderful prayer is! I truly don't even know where to start – but I would like to stress the importance of it in a Christian's life.

Open communication is a two-way street! It requires both listening and talking from both parties.

It's a no-brainer to realize how vital communication is when you consider a typical friendship. No relationship really works when one person does all the talking and doesn't take time to listen. It also doesn't work when two people go days, weeks or even months between talking with the other or one of the people doesn't make any effort to talk with the other. Open

communication is a two-way street! It requires both listening and talking from both parties. Simply put, prayer is communication with God. Don't mistake what I'm saying – God is always there to listen and to talk to you. The communication malfunction comes into play when He is there – and He always is, by the way - to talk to us and we simply aren't listening. So many times our prayers focus on us and our needs – we ask and ask and ask until we are purple in the face and then quickly end our prayers with an 'amen' and figuratively close our ears and end all communication until the next time we decide to “pray” to God. All we've accomplished through our prayers is creating lists of wants and we've left no room for God or His Will in our lives.

Prayer is so much more than repeating the same thoughts over and over again (i.e. a prayer over our meals). Truly it is meant to enhance and grow our relationships with the Almighty God. He loves us so much and wants our lives to be full of life and love. We have no business trying to be the “pilot;” let God guide our every footstep.

Prayer changes things!

Our Statement of Faith

- ❖ We believe the Holy Scriptures are the inerrant Word of God. (John 1:1, II Timothy 3:16)
- ❖ We believe that God created all things. (Colossians 1:16, John 1:3)
- ❖ We believe in the triune God, God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. (Matthew 28:19)
- ❖ We believe in the virgin birth of Jesus Christ. (Matthew 1:23)
- ❖ We believe that Jesus was wholly God and wholly man. (Romans 8:3, Philippians 2:6-7)
- ❖ We believe that there is a literal hell. (Matthew 10:28)
- ❖ We believe that there is a literal heaven. (Matthew 6:20)
- ❖ We believe that none are righteous and all are in need of a Saviour. (Romans 3:10, Revelation 20:15)
- ❖ We believe that Jesus lived a sinless life, died on the cross of Calvary and rose victorious the third day. (I Corinthians 15:3-4, I Peter 3:18, II Corinthians 5:21)
- ❖ We believe that salvation is possible only through Jesus Christ and it is His finished work on Calvary that pays our penalty for sin. (John 14:6, I Peter 1:18-21, I Corinthians 7:23)
- ❖ We believe that salvation is available to everyone. (Romans 10:13)
- ❖ We believe that salvation is free. (Ephesians 2:8-9)
- ❖ We believe that the Holy Spirit comes to dwell in your heart at the time of salvation. (John 14:16)
- ❖ We believe the Holy Spirit will teach you and guide you in the way that you should go. (John 14:26)
- ❖ We believe that Christians are dead to sin and alive in Christ. (Romans 6:11, II Corinthians 5:17)
- ❖ We believe that Christians are to live Holy separated lives before man and God. (Romans 6:12-18, I Peter 1:15-16, Titus 2:14 and I Peter 2:19)
- ❖ We believe that Jesus Christ is coming back again to take His children home to heaven. (I Thessalonians 4:15-16)

The Gift of Salvation

"For the Son of man is come to seek and to save that which was lost." (Luke 19:10)

"The Lord is not slack concerning His promise, as some men count slackness; but is longsuffering to us-ward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance." (II Peter 3:9)

The Bible tells us that we are all sinners (Romans 3:23, Romans 3:10) and in need of a Saviour (John 3:7). Man without a Saviour is the servant of sin and is destined for an eternal death (Romans 6:23). Man could not pay his penalty for sin so God sent His son to pay it for us (John 3:16, Romans 5:8). Jesus says, "I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by Me (John 14:6)." He doesn't require anything from us but simple faith (Romans 10:9-10) in the risen Christ who lived a sinless perfect life, tempted as we are yet without sin (Hebrews 4:15). He was crucified for our sins (I Peter 2:24) buried and rose again (I Corinthians 15:4) that we might live eternally in the heavens with Him (I Thessalonians 5:10). There is nothing we can do to inherit eternal life. It is the gift of God not of (our) works lest any man should boast (Ephesians 2:8-9). It isn't about us. It is about the finished work on Calvary that bought our salvation (I Corinthians 6:20). It is a personal relationship with Him and free to all (Romans 10:13). Upon receiving Him as Saviour, the Lord will come and live in your heart in the presence of the Holy Spirit (John 14:26).



If you don't know Christ as Saviour, I implore you right now to come to Him in prayer and ask Him into your heart. Realize that you are a sinner in need of a Saviour and that you can not get to heaven on your own merit. Confess to Him that you are a sinner and that you place your faith in Him, a God that can not fail. Ask Him to cleanse you of your sins by His precious sinless blood that He freely shed for you on Calvary. Ask Him to come and dwell in your heart in the person of the Holy Spirit that you may feel His presence and receive His instruction. Accept Him as Saviour and live your life according to His promises, commandments and ways. Ground yourself in His Word, the Holy Bible and find a local Bible believing church to grow in His grace and mercy and to fellowship with fellow believers.

Personal Prayer Gauge By Erika Klose

Our prayer life is a gauge for what we really believe. When we trust in God for every aspect of our lives, our prayers are filled with thanksgiving and praise. We walk in faith, living in a constant state of thanksgiving knowing that God provides for our every need (Philippians 4:19). When we fall into the trap of believing that we can run our lives better than God, our prayers become a list of “I wants”. Instead of walking in faith, we begin to run, trying to keep up with the world. Take a look for a minute ... is the needle of your “prayer gauge” pointing to prayers of praise and thanksgiving or to prayers of petition only?

If you find yourself praying a list of wants over and over again, you’ve probably lost your vision of God. Stop for a minute. Think. This is your Saviour, who died on the cross of Calvary for your sins (and mine!) ensuring that you could have eternal life and freedom from eternal torment. How amazing is that? Do you really believe you can manage your life better than Him? If so, you need a reality check and you need to step down off the throne of your life, and give God back His Lordship. A prayer of true repentance for grabbing the driver’s seat of your life accomplishes that “step down” from the throne. Only when you’ve talked to God and know the peace of the forgiveness of God (I John 1:9), can you get that gauge pointing in the right direction.

You get that self-sufficient feeling when you forget who God really is. You can not ever forget that He is your Creator (Isaiah 43:15), your Father (Matthew 6:9), your Saviour (John 3:16), your Friend (John 15:14), your Intercessor (John 17:9), and your Provider (Philippians 4:19). He promises you strength (Philippians 4:13), protection (Psalm 91:4), love (John 15:12), forgiveness (I John 1:9), companionship (Hebrews 13:5), salvation (John 3:15), grace (Ephesians 2:8), and mercy (Titus 3:5).

Once you’ve remembered just who God is and all He promises, you need to spend some time thanking Him! Maybe you need to write Him a love letter, or sing Him a song of praise. The greatest trick of the devil is to cause us to forget, even for a moment, all that God has done. You can’t forget if you’re praising God. Maybe for a week you need to make a nightly list of the things for which you are thankful. Maybe you need to make a list of all the roles that God plays in your life. Maybe you need to spend more time reading your Bible. Whatever you do, spend some time remembering. God has done great things for you and you can’t forget them! “*Bless the LORD, O my soul, and forget not all His benefits*” (Psalm 103:2).


When we spend time focused on God, instead of ourselves, the list of “I wants” will fall away and become a list of “I have in Christ Jesus”.

Friends, sometimes it’s hard to admit that we’ve done wrong, or thought wrong, or even prayed wrong. But God is faithful and promises to forgive us, pick us up, and set us back on the straight and narrow road to living for Him. Step back onto His road, follow Him, and thank Him for His marvelous works and presence in your life!

- for the entire Miller family and friends in the loss of their mother, Doris Miller and our Mama D.




