



WHAT MUST I DO TO BE SAVED?

And they said, Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved, and thy house. And they spake unto him the word of the Lord, and to all that were in his house. (Acts 16:31-32)

In this passage of scripture, the Philippian jailor asks a very important question. He wants to know how to be saved. But, what was it that brought this question to his mind? It was the actions of Paul and Silas. In the midst of great distress and torment, Paul and Silas were singing songs of Praise to the Lord. They had been thrown into prison for doing the work of the Lord. It was midnight and they had been beaten and were residing, no doubt, in a cold, damp and dreary place. But instead of wallowing in self-pity or demanding justice, Paul and Silas were singing praises to God. The Philippian jailor saw this and it had a profound affect on his life.

Then the earthquake came. Suddenly, everyone's bands were loosed and they were free. However, none of them were gone. The jailor knew that something huge was happening when his prisoners did not run away. He knew that something bigger than all of them was at work. It was this realization that brought him to repentance.

What about you? Let's look at the Christian first. Does your life reflect that something bigger is going on than what meets the normal eye? Do your actions testify to the glory of God? When troubles come do you proclaim His presence in the midst of the storm? Or would it be more accurate to say that you murmur and complain even at the smallest setbacks. Do you view every event as an opportunity to praise the Lord? There is much to learn from this passage, but perhaps for the Christian, the most important lesson found in this passage is that we are a walking testimony of God's grace, mercy and love. As such, we must walk in His ways so that others may come to know Him.

Now let's look at the sinner in need of a Saviour. The greatest need of your life is the need for salvation. Nothing will fill the void in your heart, but Jesus. Nothing will buy you a home in heaven, or give you life eternal with Jesus, but a personal relationship with Him. Make no mistake. You will live for eternity. The question is where. Will you spend eternity in heaven, a place of eternal bliss and joy with the One who died for you? Or will you spend eternity in hell, a place of eternal torment, darkness and separation from God? The choice is yours. All you have to do to inherit eternal life with Jesus and to have a personal relationship with God that brings a joy unspeakable and a peace that passes understanding is "*Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved.*"

THE PRAYER CLOSET

The information found in the Prayer Closet section of the newsletter will help you develop a deeper, closer walk with God! A closer walk with God will lead you to a deeper, richer life. Much is learned in the closet of prayer. Many battles are fought and won while we study and pray. Stay tuned to this section for tips and ideas that you can use to make the most of your time in the prayer closet.



Let me clarify that most of us do not pray in a closet. This is the term I give to that quiet little place that you get alone with God to study and pray. Today's tip will focus on learning to focus on God and His Son, Jesus.

Tip: Step 3—Focusing on God and His Son, Jesus

After finding a quiet place for prayer and study and making sure you have gathered the necessary materials it is time to Pray. In our last newsletter we got started with our prayer time and walked through the first two steps of our time in the prayer closet. First we determined the prayer requests that were on our heart and mind and jotted them in our prayer journal, freeing us to move further into our prayer closet. Secondly, we examined ourselves and did business with God, so He would hear our prayers. In this newsletter we are going to explore Step 3, Focusing on God and His Son, Jesus, moving ourselves even further into our prayer closet and closer to God.

This step involves really concentrating on who God is and what Jesus has done for us and through us. It involves being thankful, not just generally but specifically. It involves adoring the Lord and praising Him for who He is, what He has done and whose we are. It is a time of exalting Christ and allowing Him to be King of our heart and Lord of our life. This part of our time spent in the prayer closet really conditions our heart for worship. In fact, as we go through this process we are worshipping the Lord. This time spent will truly transform your day and change you forever in ways you cannot imagine.

Speak of how praying and loving God brings about growth in our own lives. Use this flower garden to remind you of God's hand upon your life and His ability to produce great results in those who yield themselves to Him and who spend time with Him. Make this year's flower garden fertile soil for the Lord to do His work in you.

For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.*”

It is a personal decision you have to make on your own. You cannot save anyone else and no other person can save you. Think about it as if you would any other personal relationship. I can’t have a conversation with someone and then later say that you were the one who had that conversation. It is as personal as any relationship you have.

Being saved is a simple step – it might not be easy to admit that we’re not perfect, so it may be difficult in that regard. However, the simplicity of salvation is unmatched. Delve into Romans to learn all about the simplicity of salvation!

THE GIFT OF SALVATION

"For the Son of man is come to seek and to save that which was lost."(Luke 19:10)

"The Lord is not slack concerning His promise, as some men count slackness; but is longsuffering to us-ward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance." (II Peter 3:9)

The Bible tells us that we are all sinners (Romans 3:23, Romans 3:10) and in need of a Saviour (John 3:7). Man without a Saviour is the servant of sin and is destined for an eternal death (Romans 6:23). Man could not pay his penalty for sin, so God sent His son to pay it for us (John 3:16, Romans 5:8). Jesus says, "I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by Me" (John 14:6). He doesn't require anything from us but simple faith (Romans 10:9-10) in the risen Christ who lived a sinless, perfect life, tempted as we are yet without sin (Hebrews 4:15). He was crucified for our sins, (I Peter 2:24) buried and rose again (I Corinthians 15:4) that we might live eternally in the heavens with Him (I Thessalonians 5:10). There is nothing we can do to inherit eternal life. It is the gift of God not of (our) works lest any man should boast (Ephesians 2:8-9). It isn't about us. It is about the finished work on Calvary that bought our salvation (I Corinthians 6:20). It is a personal relationship with Him and free to all (Romans 10:13). Upon receiving Him as Saviour, the Lord will come and live in your heart in the presence of the Holy Spirit (John 14:26).



If you don't know Christ as Saviour, we implore you right now to come to Him in prayer and ask Him into your heart. Realize that you are a sinner in need of a Saviour and that you cannot get to heaven on your own merit. Confess to Him that you are a sinner and that you place your faith in Him, a God that cannot fail. Ask Him to cleanse you of your sins by His precious sinless blood that He freely shed for you on Calvary. Ask Him to come and dwell in your heart in the person of the Holy Spirit that you may feel His presence and receive His instruction. Accept Him as Saviour and live your life according to His promises, commandments and ways. Ground yourself in His Word, the Holy Bible, and find a local Bible - believing church to grow in His grace and mercy and to fellowship with fellow believers.

DO YOU KNOW MY JESUS? BY ERIKA KLOSE

One of my favorite hymns is "Do you know my Jesus?" Here are the words:

Have you a heart that's weary,
Tending a load of care?
Are you a soul that's seeking
Rest from the burden you bear?

Where is your heart, O pilgrim?
What does your light reveal?
Who hears your call for comfort
When naught but sorrows you feel?

Who knows your disappointments?
Who hears each time you cry?
Who understands your heartaches?
Who dries the tears from your eyes?

Do you know my Jesus?
Do you know my friend?
Have you heard He loves you,
And that He will abide till the end?

The song asks: Do you know the Jesus that I know? Do you know the rest of knowing Christ? Do you know the comfort of knowing Christ? Do you know the love of Christ? Do you know that my Jesus will never leave you, nor forsake you (Hebrews 13:5)?

I awoke with this song in my head this morning. I awoke thanking God for my Jesus. You see my Jesus loves me. He tells me in John 3:16 that, "*God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life.*" My Jesus loves me so much that He died for me - so that He wouldn't have to spend eternity away from me.

You see, my Jesus knew me before I was even born. "*For thou hast possessed my reins: thou hast covered me in my mother's womb. I will praise thee; for I am fearfully and wonderfully made: marvellous are thy works; and that my soul knoweth right well. My substance was not hid from thee, when I was made in secret, and curiously wrought in the lowest parts of the earth*" (Psalms 139:13-15). My Jesus knew the person that I would be. He had a plan for my life. "*Before I formed thee in the belly I knew thee; and before thou camest forth out of the womb I sanctified thee*" (Jeremiah 1:5). Before I was ever formed, my Jesus knew the woman I would become.

My Jesus also knew that for the beginning of my life, I wouldn't know Him. He knew that I was a sinner. "*For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God*" (Romans 3:23). My Jesus knew, that like so many of those He created, it would take me a while to come to know Him. But my Jesus also never gives up. "*The Lord is not slack concerning His promise, as some men count slackness; but is longsuffering to us-ward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance*" (II Peter 3:9).

My Jesus knew, that like so many of those He created, it would take me a while to come to know Him. But my Jesus also never gives up.

When I saw my sin, and understood that I needed a Saviour, my Jesus was that Saviour. He paid the penalty for my sin and gave me the greatest gift, "*For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord*" (Romans 6:23). My sins would have sent me to hell, but when my Jesus became my Saviour, He paid that penalty and gave me eternal life with Him. My Jesus forgave me of all my sin. My Jesus died on the cross and cleansed me from all my sin with His shed blood. "*But God commendeth His love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us. Much more then, being now justified by His blood, we shall be saved from wrath through Him*" (Romans 5:8-9). My Jesus made a way for me to be with Him forever.

My sins would have sent me to hell, but when my Jesus became my Saviour, He paid that penalty and gave me eternal life with Him.

My Jesus never leaves my side. He is my constant companion, "*But the Comforter, which is the Holy Ghost, whom the Father will send in my name, he shall teach you all things, and bring all things to your remembrance, whatsoever I have said unto you*" (John 14:6). He teaches me and guides me. My Jesus comforts me. He prays for me. "*I pray for them: I pray not for the world, but for them which Thou hast given me; for they are thine*" (John 17:9). "*Wherefore He is able also to save them to the uttermost that come unto God by Him, seeing He ever liveth to make intercession for them*" (Hebrews 7:25).

When I mess up and disappoint my Jesus, He forgives me. "*If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness*" (1 John 1:9). He dusts the sins of the world from me, and sends me on my way - walking by my side. My Jesus wants me to ever grow closer to Him. My Jesus is my friend. "*Ye are my friends, if ye do whatsoever I command you*" (John 15:14).


My Jesus loves me completely, has forgiven me completely, and is planning a future in Heaven for me.


